

Purpose

The Photography Center of the Capital District LLC offers to those interested in the photographic arts opportunities to develop skills and knowledge in all aspects of photographic activity. The PhotoCenter is a membership-supported facility offering almost everything photographic under one roof:

- The PhotoCenter Gallery exhibiting a variety of imagery including; contemporary images, theme exhibitions, member's work, regional and international photographers
- The PhotoCenter Library dedicated to art and photography, which is a reading/research floor with over eight thousand books and collections of periodicals past and current;
- The Photography Center of the Capital District Museum; with displays of historical cameras and images dating back more than 100 years;
- The PhotoCenter store selling gently used photographic equipment including; cameras, printers, lenses, flashes, accessories and books, Distributing inkAID™ pre-coating, for dynamic digital prints;
- A shooting studio; equipped with backgrounds, and lighting equipment
- Computer workstations with a variety of peripherals and photographic software;
- ###Equipment for do-it-yourself photographing, editing, printing, scanning, mounting, matting, exhibition assembling and more!
- Monthly activity schedule with featured PhotoCenter nights, workshops and private tutorials covering the spectrum of photography; and
- Annual member exhibition and publication opportunities

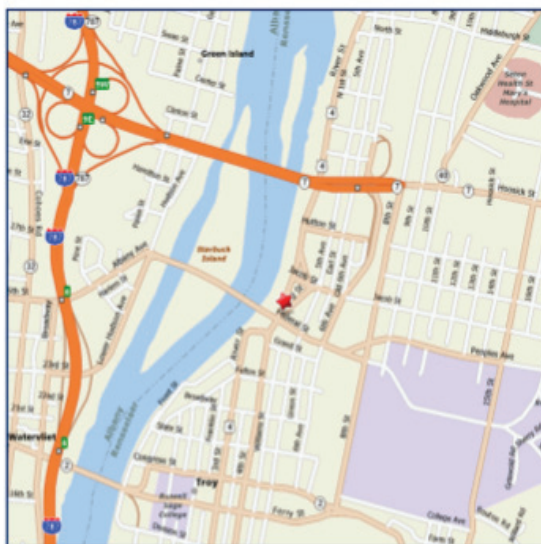

- Providing access to education materials on the history of photography;
- Demonstrating the use of early photographic equipment;
- Showing linkages between the appearance of early images and the equipment used to produce them.

What you will find in Troy

Troy has become a lively focus for practitioners and consumers of the visual and performing arts. Within a few blocks of the PhotoCenter is the Arts Center of the Capital Region, and numerous other arts venues, Troy Music Hall, three bookstores, great shopping including, the ever growing Farmer's Market, an antique district, numerous ethnic restaurants, and the Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and Russell Sage College campuses.

Across the street from the PhotoCenter are five restaurants and taverns, including a deli, micro-brewery, an Irish pub, a martini lounge, a fine dining establishment and a Mexican-Irish restaurant, as well as a notable performance venue, Revolution Hall. Troy artists, galleries, and businesses coordinate exhibitions and receptions for a monthly last Friday "Troy Night Out," featuring the arts and culture of downtown Troy and drawing enthusiasts from throughout the region.



Directions Easy access from the interstate

From I-787 Northbound take Exit 8 "Green Island" to Troy. Bear right at next two lights to cross over Green Island Bridge. Go left at light after bridge onto King Street. The next two lefts will put you on River Street, one way going south. The PhotoCenter is down the block on the left.

From I-87, use Exit 7 for Route 7 East. Continue to exit "Downtown Troy, Hutton Street" and proceed on Hutton Street to River Street. (Hutton ends at River Street.) Go left on River Street two blocks to the PhotoCenter.

Free Parking

The City of Troy lot behind River Street offers free parking after 5 p.m. Its entrance is across the street from the PhotoCenter.
